Old-school hobby 'something to do'

Revell has resurgence of model kit sales

While auto sales slump during the coronavirus shutdown, build-it-yourself plastic versions at 1/25th the size are flying off the shelves.

Revell, the 77-year-old model kit maker that was acquired out of bankruptcy two years ago by a German investment fund, has seen a resurgence as a growing number of people stuck at home during the pandemic painstakingly piece together everything from '60s muscle cars to

Carl Knable - Completed over the past five weeks - 1/72nd Hasegawa TA-4J's and OA-4M, 1/48th Kittyhawk Banshee and Skunkworks F-16XL (both built for Paul Milam). Under construction - all 1/72nd: Airfix B-25, Kinetic F-16, and Italeri C-47.








Hector Colon - My current project is the 1/48 Monogram TBD-1 Devastator which I am building for my oldest friend. This kit has been a thorn in my side since Mr. Estrin's 8th grade science class in Jr. High school. I am determined to complete the kit.

It will have the Eduard photo-etch set #48-278 along with resin wheels and a base made of the WW2 aircraft carrier deck also from Eduard. I am hoping to have it mostly completed by our May meeting.



Kurt Van Dahm - I am working on an old AMT kit off the shelf of Someday Builds. The Dodge Hemi engine is from a Don Garlits' Wynns' Jammer front engine dragster kit. The magneto was scratch-built, and the plug wires are connected in the proper firing order. The fuel lines are in place but need final adjusting & straightening. The deck opening for the engine had to be enlarged to fit the engine. The driver cockpit was narrowed and opened up at the stern to provide adequate room for the driver. Exhaust pipes have been added at the stern waterline.



James Fulkerson - Well, I took photos of a couple of projects that aren't quite done yet. The first is the new 1/72 scale Eagle Transporter from Space: 1999. It's a nice kit, but will look much better once I get it painted and some decals on it. I also still need to attach the landing gear and vertical thrust engines.

The second photo, well, "Say hello to my little friends!" 1/12 BB-8, R2-D2, and C-3PO from Star Wars. Not done with these, either (3PO needs some weathering, and there are parts still to attach to the others). They're snap-together kits from Bandai, and fairly good quality. I'll bring them around to the next meeting we have.



Mike Knowski - So here's my latest projects. The King Tiger is 1/35th scale from Tamiya with resin zimmerit by cavalier, Aber gun barrel, metal tracks from Fruilmodel. Next is Tamiya's 1/35th Jagdpanzer IV. Metal gun barrel by Tamiya and Fruilmodel metal tracks. Then there's Tamiya's 1/35th Tiger I. Aber gun barrel, zimmerit is the Tamiya stick on which worked out well as far as I am concerned, and Tamiya's plastic individual tracks. Finishing up the armor is Tamiya's 1/35th scale Brummbar. This is the old version and is straight out of the box. Moving onto the figures in 28mm, Warlord's Foot Grenadiers of the Imperial guard band.

That completes the finished projects. I'm working on this resin Viking in 77mm. I'm not sure who the manufacturer is but I'm pretty sure it's Pegaso.



Bill Vinikour - My wife and I (see photo to your right) are staying at home like most of us. This has provided me time to work on my birthday present – The Gorgon from Black Heart Enterprises.



The Gorgon is a half-scale resin bust that requires little to no cleanup of mold lines. The kit comes pre-primed in gray and includes some 23 snakes – each with highly detailed scales. A nice feature of the kit is that the front portion of many of the snakes magnetically attach. (If entered in a contest, and you do not want to glue these components on, a note would need to be added to the contest form to let the judges know why seams were not filled.)



The photos show my progress since early March. Various reference photos were used on deciding the coloration for the snakes. I have selectively chosen some of the snakes to be more detailed than others. For example, the yellow-bodied snake on top of her head (Photo 4) was detailed with sepia acrylic ink dots and blotches, and these were given extra detail with dots of Vallejo vomit paint. Hundreds of these dots were added using a toothpick. Similarly, the one black snake (Photo 4) was detailed with Vallejo's Japanese WWII Uniform paint – again applied with a toothpick (the various sized dots and streaks are similar to what is on the real snake used for inspiration). I should mention, that real snakes do not always have a solid color on each scale, so judges should be made aware of that (if one really is doing that on purpose, and not just a crummy painter – I must say that painting individual scales on large-scale models is a challenge for “senior” modelers). There are several tongues included with the kit that have not been applied yet. I also have much more detailing to do with the snakes, including those snakes with open mouths.

I have barely started on the Gorgon herself. My initial thoughts are to have the dress a glittering gold using gold glitter mica flakes. The portion of the bust that does not have scale detail (central portion of the body and face) will be done based on the character Ronan from The Guardians of the Galaxy. This will be accomplished using gunmetal mica powder overlaid with black mica flakes. The rest of the Gorgon will be either various greens or, possibly, copper (using mica powder and flakes). Her eyes will eventually be a glowing green. Progress update next month!



Ihor Hlohowskyj – Finished the Panzer IV D and added a companion piece, a Zundapp 700 motorcycle from the old Tamiya Flak 88 kit. Now working on the Long Range Desert Group command car but modifying it to a ‘Scorpion’ in which the Breda 20mm AA gun is carried in the back rather than towed, and no command radio. The mod involved removing the radio and boxing its location, removing the molded boards around the top of the bed, adding wooden framing to the front half of the bed, and moving the Bren gun location to the bed. A fun kit. Used hair spray for weathering. The Breda AA gun is separately bagged in the kit and is gorgeous just by itself (Tamiya got it from Italeri).



Stan Kurcz - I finally finished this Minicraft Boeing Stratocruiser. It's not one of Minicraft's better kits! I replaced the engine nacelles (Thanks Carl!) and then filled and rescribed the panel lines. One day I will make new replacement props but for now I am calling it done. Overall, I'm happy with it especially since it's the first time I have been able to do a two-tone finish.

I am doing well. I began the lockdown trying to weed out old magazines & reference materials, but the National Geographic virus quickly took over. You know, the one where you start looking thru them and 4 hours later you have 3 mags to throw out and "Boxes" of them going back on the shelf! Anyway, I am discovering a good deal of pictures & materials I had forgotten about. Hopefully I will be able to finish a few more models by next month. Stay safe! Cheers!



Modeling on the Net

With the lockdown that we are all experiencing due to the Covid-19 virus, having time to enjoy our hobby is now either in abundance or at a premium. I for one have found very little time to hide in my hobby room, between working from home and my “Honey Do “ list (you know that list that we kept saying we would get to when we have time), my time in my hobby room is at a premium. Since we are all spending time at home and not going out to enjoy life in the real world, the internet has become, at least for me, an even bigger resource tool. My current project, the 1/48 TBD Devastator from Monogram, is giving me an opportunity to truly research this aircraft. Once completed, it will represent one of the aircraft from Torpedo Squadron 8 from the Battle of Midway. This kit has been a thorn in my side since junior high school and I am determined to complete this monster. And yet, with all the information readily available on the internet, it took a phone call to a fellow club member to explain the color scheme of the flight deck during the battle. So yes, the internet is invaluable source of information, but we must not forget the resource of our own club members. So, thank you Don Grajak for taking the call and answering all my questions.

Now, if I were to attempt to cover all the websites that are currently available and/or that have something to do with modeling – this column would be several thousand pages long and our editor would be trying to figure out how to download a multiple terabyte size file (*ed. – No, I would be saying ‘forget it!’*). I promise that I will not even try to cover everything, just an attempt to highlight a select few. (Don’t forget to look at the sites and links that Stan has provided in the article following this one).

Now the first website that I wish to highlight is **Aircraft Resource Center** (www.aircraftresourcecenter.com). This website is easy to navigate and presents walkaround photo albums of aircraft categorized by aircraft type – bi-plane, propeller, jet and helicopter. The site also new product reviews, a member forum, kit reviews, and even a joke page. So, if you’re looking for up close photos of aircraft this website is a great starting point.

Next up, **F-16.net** (www.F-16.net), which bills itself as the ultimate website for the F-16 Fighting Falcon. The photo gallery alone is worth a visit to this site. The gallery contains photos of F-16s in the livery of every nation that currently flies the Falcon. Photos are categorized by version, country – United States Air Force, Navy and Air National Guard) along with European, Middle Eastern, Asian and South American. The site also contains technical data, pilot flight hours and unit markings. In addition, they have added information for both the F-22 Raptor and the F-35 Lightning II.

For the fan of the P-51 Mustang as well as the Ford Mustang, there is **MustangsMustangs** (www.mustangsmustangs.com). This website offers information on arguably the finest fighter aircraft of WW II, the North American P-51 Mustang, AND the ultimate pony car – the Ford Mustang. The Ford Mustang portion of the website is undergoing an upgrade and is not currently available. However, the P-51 portion of the site shows the aircraft during its military career throughout current day as an air racer.

Finally, the **Nautical Research Guild** (www.thenrg.org) offers a range of resources for the model ship builder. Founded in 1948, the guild offers just about everything you can ask for in respects to

ships. Their member forum, *Model Ship World*, has a vast array of topics, hints and subjects. The guild's motto *Advancing Ship Modeling Through Research* is clearly evident throughout their entire site. So, if you're a ship builder or have any interest in ships, then you need to start with this site.

Next month I will be covering a few of the modeling forum websites. I am hesitant to cover these sites do serve a purpose as an avenue for research, but they do at times turn into avenues of complaints. We have all seen the "My model didn't get a medal at this or that show. The club sucks and I'm never coming back!" posts. Eventually I will be tackling the proverbial 500-pound gorilla --- YouTube. So, if you have any comments, suggestions or critiques send them along. So, until next time, what's on your bench?


PACTRA, AZTEK, and Model Master Update

Seeking information about the status of several of Testors' long-standing paint lines, we have received the following from Vince Pierri, Senior Manager, PR & Corporate Communications for Rust-Oleum:

"With a long history of producing quality hobby kits and supplies, we are evolving our strategy to focus more keenly on Testors, our flagship brand. To that end, we are discontinuing our PACTRA, AZTEK, and Model Master brands as demand for these products continues to decline. We will continue to support the hobby market with a robust line of aerosols, brush paints, tools and accessories – always looking for opportunities to innovate in these categories."

We have no idea how long this change will take to implement or how soon it will affect the availability of the paints and supplies.




